The overall objective of the project was to assist in resolving the problems of refugees and IDPs in Serbia by enhancing their capacities, to both obtain and retain employment within the social services sector and by designing and managing grant scheme for social inclusion and assisted employment.



SUPPORT FOR IMPROVEMENT OF THE LIVING CONDITIONS OF FORCED MIGRANTS AND CLOSURE OF COLLECTIVE CENTRES — FOR BETTER LIFE, SERBIA, EU – IPA, 2014–2016, 919.750 €

Project aimed to provide assistance to the EUD and the beneficiary institutions in implementation and monitoring of grant activities under Grant Scheme divided into three lots aiming at finding adequate living conditions and social and community integration of forced migrants who choose to stay in Serbia while supporting the sustainable return of those wishing to return to Kosovo.
